## Hill of Fare Wind Farm Update

It is important that representations focus on the material planning considerations. HoFWIG will be publishing advice on what these are very soon but they include Landscape and Visual impact, potential for noise, the effect on water supplies and the issue of peatland disturbance on the Hill of Fare. Torphins Community Council (TCC) will discuss the application at our meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> December in the Learney Hall, open as usual to everyone. We shall consider the views of the community in deciding our response to the ECU and whether or not to object to the application.

TCC will do all it can to keep everyone informed.
